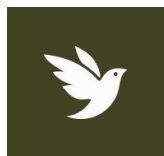

The Punta Banda Estuary is one of the four main coastal lagoons in the region. It is home to around 640 species of terrestrial and marine flora and fauna, including native and introduced species, as well as migratory and resident species.
